#### Cindy Deutekom VP Genus Hosta Report

Foliar Nematode Research Project -Progress Report

We have some very encouraging results from our Stage 1 testing. A variety of products including Clorox, ZeroTol, Nemakill, Pylon and Ammonia proved 100% effective with direct contact in test wells.

Hosta buds and soil samples were collected from selected gardens in Tennessee in February and were examined for overwintering nematode juveniles and eggs. Once again no eggs were found in the buds, but nematode juveniles were found in the buds and in the soil. As Dr. Grewal has published previously, the nematodes only overwinter in the juvenile form but not as eggs. Tissue staining in another experiment confirms previous findings that the nematodes do not infect hosta tissues/buds and most-likely move externally to invade and infect expanded leaves in the spring. This makes any potential nematode treatment a bit simpler, as we do not have to worry about the eggs sitting in the hosta buds during the winter.

For the second phase, the best of the products used in Phase I will be used. The Advisory Committee is currently evaluating which products to test further.

Two experiments will be done in the next 3 months. The first will apply treatment at soil and crowns to prevent foliar nematodes from migrating upwards and producing leaf symptoms. The second experiment will be to evaluate the selected chemicals to prevent nematode infection from occurring.
