

Our History

The American Hosta Society (AHS) is a nonprofit organization established in 1968 to foster and promote knowledge of and interest in the genus *Hosta*, and to encourage introduction of the genus into cultivation. The American Hosta Society is also the International Cultivar Registration Authority for the genus *Hosta*.

In 1998, the American Hosta Society designated hostas as the "Friendship Plant." Alex J. Summers, a founder of the Society and the first President, declared that "The American Hosta Society is a society of people not plants." Though hostas brought us together, friendship is what has sustained the AHS for more than five decades.

Hostas — America's Most Popular Perennial


